Q15a In the previous question you indicated a local area issue that needed to be prioritised was "overtourism". Could you please tell us the location you are referring to and the times (i.e. weekends / school holidays) where overtourism is a problem)

- Visitors should be encouraged to support our small local businesses, not just the big 'experiences,' and spread their visitation around the region. Weekends in Olinda and Sassafras are often bananas, with limited parking and toilets, while other nearby villages are less visited.
- Olinda and sassafras on weekends, not enough parking so not even locals can/will go out
- I might have selected the wrong button. Sometimes impossible to get to Healesville from Coldstream way - traffic can be tedious

- Weekends in Warburton.
- Melba Hwy, Bell street Yarra glen - traffic congestion with travellers returning home or going away on any long weekend or school holidays.
- Belgrave - roundabout near Puffing Billy

- Travelling to Olinda on a public holiday or weekend is a nightmare also accessing destinations such as Alfred Nichols Gardens / Rhododendron Gardens on a Weekend is very tricky and unfortunately locals have to avoid these areas and cannot utilise these places in our own backyard due to tourism
- From Yarra Glen to Healesville is a nightmare on weekends at any of the things already of interest in this area such as the Choclaterie, Alowyn Gardens, Healesville Sanctuary, anywhere in the Dandenongs. There are way too many people that makes going anywhere not fun. My extended family in Victoria and from interstate actively avoid going to the places that are overloaded with tourists as it makes the whole visit unenjoyable and just like being in a crowded inner city place
- Warburton. Think it's pretty evident why. Poor road network/flow. Poor public parking. Tourist hotspots limited parking/public transport non-existent. Olinda/Sassafras similar issues with limited parking/ poor traffic management. Issues occuring frequently on weekends and public holidays/school holidays.
- To many people for the town to cope with
- This survey tells me that you would like to make tourist precincts such as being touted for Warburton. We live in this area because it is quiet and not overcrowded, why would we want it to change?
- I love this area and all it has to offer, this issue is that often as a local I miss out on what this area has to offer due to being crowded by tourist. I know tourism is very important but it needs to be managed so it is not at the expense of locals enjoying where they pay to live.
- Towns on Mount Dandenong during weekends and school holidays

- Traffic on the weekends and school holidays can be hard on locals trying to just getting onto the highways or getting a park to do local shops. Visitor leave rubbish every where. We saw a lady changing her baby in the back seat of her car and throw the nappy and rubbish on the ground! The roads need to be updated to accommodated the extra road users. I understand every town need visitors but you need the people living here paying rates to afford to do a lot of the up grades required. Please consider us as well. Some of us live here for a quite life.
- Warburton particularly on weekends, school holidays but you can also find mid week, the town is packed, facilities not coping. Illegal parking, rubbish dumping & people relieving themselves in public due to lack of facilities. Camp fires left burning.
- Warburton and it's surrounds. Fix the roads, expand the Infrastructure before promoting tourism. The water park is a lovely destination but only allocating 20 car parks was idiotic. Woods point road CANNOT handle the volume of families who choose to park on the side to access the water park. Many times parents grab kids at the last second before they U knowingly step into oncoming traffic.
- The entire Warburton Highway is a problem from Lilydale to Reefton more especially on weekends and public holidays, for some reason the council believes that tourists spend all this money in our towns they in fact don't they use our free facilities and don't spend any money leave all their rubbish behind for us to spend the money on cleaning it up I'm not sure where you're getting your information from but it doesn't seem to be very on the ball
- Warburton / wesburn needs infrastructure before promotion of more tourism to support the boom on weak ends or events
- Warburton, Dandenong Ranges are all unequipped to deal with the massive influx of people they are quaint towns that you can't change being quaint or you won't have the people wanting to visit
- Over-tourism is an issue generally throughout the Dandenong Range and Yarra Valley. Weekend can be a nightmare, tourists not confident driving in the area, slowing traffic, causing congestion, and then there are cyclists. Warburton is an example. Speaking to business operators ,many who come up for the day are looking for a cheap day out, not willing to spend a lot of money, congest shops, choke road flow [and carparks] with cars, bikes, and dogs [and I am a dog lover]. Off leash dogs with over tourism and resultant, waste not cleaned up are issues.
- Weekends are impossible to get into town and the amount of inconsiderate cyclists on the mountain is ridiculous
- Healesville at the weekends, parking impossible. Locals tend not to go into town unless absolutely essential
- Weekends and public holidays.....Warburton
- Warburton on the weekends. I no longer visit Warburton or other tourist destinations over the weekend.
- Weekends and school holidays, locals can hardly get around the mountain. Way too many tourists on the roads that cant drive to the conditions and congest the road
- Rockford concerts. When concerts on inconvenienced by no phone service, slow internet, traffic congestion on Maroondah hwy between Healesville and Coldstream, dangerous

driving. After long weekends traffic banked up to 2km out of Healesville. My husband was in the cfa and couldn't turn out to fires as he couldn't get to the fire station

- I didn't say there was over tourism. I don't want it
- Olinda area on weekends public holidays....traffic congestion, not adequate signage. Visitors blocking private roads along Ridge rd for sunsets. People leaving rubbish in parks, blaring music in public spaces , not respecting peace and quiet of Mountain. Hoons in evening doing laps of Ridge rd and Tourist rd
- Weekends/school holidays given there is very minimal infrastructure to support the influx of visitors. Risk management in fire risk periods. Poor roads!!
- Weekends and public holly are bad but special events such as the tulip festival cause the tourist traffic to become dangerous!
- Olinda, too many tourist no parking Weekends school holidays any holidays
- Traffic congestion along Station Street on weekends, plus the increased traffic on Maroondah Hwy making it even harder to go from Station St or Killara Rd onto Maroondah Hwy. Tourism just adds to our woes since traffic lights never get installed.
- Weekends in the Yarra Valley are crazy how much is enough? We are becoming affected in our residential areas with the influx of airbnb type accommodation taking over attracts huge groups partying on in our residential areas. Keep tourism in the mixed use ,commercial areas please . Our homes are important and we should be able to use them for the intended use
- In general, need to be sensitive to environment to minimise impact-not too many visitors to area.
- road network overcrowded, parking difficult for locals on weekends and public holidays, rubbish left by tourists, destruction of nature by visitors, visitor behaviour 0- eg a family group of 5 cyclists on the narrow path beside the river in warburton - path barely wide enough for one pedestrian let alone 5 cyclists "racing" along narrow path and causing further degradation by bikes and fast riding. Disobedient tourists who ignore signs of any description ie closed, rubbish/litter everywhere
- At Olinda and Belgrave in particular, on the weekends. The traffic can get pretty bad and its hard to find parking as a local needing to do regular grocery shopping etc.
- Over tourism is wrecking Warburton. There has been a loss of community spirit. We do not go into the village on weekends and public holidays- it is just too awful. We are very concerned if there was a major incident and visitors and residents could not get out, and the loss of open space and the natural environment given over to planned car parks
- Nicholas gardens and surrounding forest and picnic areas Esp at weekends and public holidays
- Upper Yarra, Olinda, Sassafras, Monbulk to name a few.
- Weekends
- Weekends, School holidays, Warburton Water Park. Designed and named by school children...Locals who rarely ever get to use it now at weekends and holidays. Overcrowded. Great to have Tennis and Basketball for families and especially after school when kids ride their bikes and come and use the courts. After school water park or Play Groups i the

morning. Visint disabled Groups can only come on a weekday in term time. Donna Buange when snow up there. Signs need to let tourists know when they get to yarra Junction both venues already full. PARKING Attendants could make a fortune on Fining illegal parking. Tourists have no care where they park even if it says NO PARKING.!!

- Most destinations on weekends
- Kallista, Belgrave, sassafras Olinda etc. weekends and holidays. Locals need to allow an extra 30-60 mins to leave the mountain due to tourists leaving. Especially at Belgrave roundabout. Also major fire hazard for locals. Tourists coming up having no idea on how to drive to the speed limit causing major frustration. Tourists not knowing where they are going so suddenly slam on brakes. Bike riders having no consideration for anyone. Also major fire hazard for locals
- Olinda and Sassafras are over full at weekends, Car parking is dangerous, cars park on footpaths and obstruct around Cloudehill and Olinda Tea House. Need to have a bus service across the hills that allows folk to park at the bottom and tour around, not drive and choke the roads.
- Warburton is often over capacity and council propose to invite 2000 more visitors each weekend for the WMBD. It poses a significant risk for both the residents and visitors. There is one road in and one road out. A small country town with one high street in a deep valley is inescapable in the event of a significant emergency such as bushfire. Council is not only negligent but outright willful in their actions to endanger the safety of the residents. All due to to the ego and arrogance of our mayor.
- Grands Picnic Ground is overcrowded, mostly on weekends and public holidays. Lots of non-local tourists feed native birds, although it is prohibited, which affects the natural behaviour of the birds. Also, dogs in no-dogs national park areas and reserves (for example, Birdsland and Sherbrooke forest region) are common because the regulations are poorly controlled. Similar situation with bike riders. Some non-local tourists dispose of their rubbish along walking trails and picnic areas showing low respect to "take your rubbish with you" signs. Potentially, placing rubbish bins in key localities and their regular servicing would help.
- Our town (Warburton) can't cope with drive-in tourists on weekends and school holidays because there isn't enough parking.
- 1000 Steps at weekends. Grants Picnic ground weekends. Olinda Golf Course at weekends. Dandenong Tourist Road at weekends.
- All the towns in the Dandenongs and surrounding areas get very congested during weekends and any time of good weather. This makes it difficult for locals to get around and to enjoy the area ourselves. The tulip festival in particular can be very problematic causing very long delays.
- As a local we avoid going out on weekends locally because of traffic from tourists - if we go out on the weekends, we leave the yarra valley.
- Warburton water park. Weekends
- The villages Sassafras and Olinda at weekends. Traffic congestion on the major access roads intersections (Mtn Highway/Tourist Road, Tourist Rd / Monbulk Road).

- Warburton is overwhelmed by too many visitors most of the time. Noise and pollution are ruining our lovely town.
- Olinda, weekends
- I have lived in Olinda for 20 years. Tourism growth has increased litter, dog waste, traffic, noise, pollution and environmental damage. Facilities growth has not matched this demand growth, and when facilities are built its been done in a manner which damages the natural values of the area. Residents concerns are ignored, and consultation processes have been shams (note the Merlin's led bulldozing process which led to Olinda green). Stop making economic growth a priority over quality of life of residents and wildlife.
- Access for locals is more difficult due to overcrowding. Bike riding on the Tourist Road is a nightmare - waiting for an accident to happen and also delaying commutes. Overcrowding in cafes - particularly bike riders with their bikes blocking entrances. Roads are overcrowded, particularly with visitors not knowing where they are going and parking in areas where they shouldn't be. Traffic in Olinda is horrendous - coming out of Olinda/Monbulk Road on to the Tourist Road and parking. Car park at the old Olinda Golf Course is disgraceful and a free for all. Rubbish bins (when used) at all locations are either insufficient or non existent. All these are mainly affected at weekends, particularly so on long weekends.
- The dandenong ranges all over. Weekends and school holidays mostly but it is now even weekdays the road are getting very busy. Sometimes I dont even bother going to the local shops on weekends due to the traffic. Lots of litter around the walking trails and picnic areas
- ..
- High level of traffic congestion through Belgrave and surrounding areas on weekends and public/school holidays. Visitors not obeying road rules slowing down and blocking roads bad parking .
- Sassafras is often out of control on weekends and public holidays. Also, the roads leading out to the Yarra Valley wineries on the weekends are jammed with traffic.
- Weekends . Warburton hwy congested . Drivers wreck less speeding
- Olinda and Sassafras on the weekends
- Warburton, Healesville and the Dandenongs get too busy on weekends. There needs to be more better accessible public transport to these areas to reduce traffic and parking issues. Most locals I speak to in these areas avoid leaving the house on weekends because they can't move about their town freely.
- Melba highway can become very busy. Warburton highway and Warburton can too become quite crowded at times
- Weekends in Healesville, Warburton, Redwood forest - over conjection and lack of infrastructure to accommodate the (weekend/holiday) influx i.e. minimal public transport available, roads not fit for purpose, little to no car parking. Tourism is a very important part of our community, however tourism must be managed and balanced without losing the natural beauty of this region or impacting small businesses that make up a huge part of the uniqueness of this region (it's a BIG NO from me to big commercial businesses moving into the more regional areas)

- Weekends in Olinda/Sassafras. Too many crowds/ vehicles. Non compliance with local regulations. Visitors from out of town bringing their dogs. No regulation of parking, many vehicles parked illegally. Signed turnout lanes/areas on Mountain Highway are an absolute priority, to many slow drivers, driving in a manner speed dangerous <30/40KM.
- Warburton is full of over tourism / this survey is aimed at mountain biking and anyone from anywhere can fill this in to say they want things in certain towns just by putting in a postcode when they don't have to live every day with trying to get through the traffic, bikes, pedestrians, lack of services and long emergency waits for actual local residents like myself that just want the simple infrastructure first in place before tourism to create balance
- Every Sunday in the Main Street of Olinda, absolutely cannot get a car park if the locals want to go up the street to get a pie, newspaper, coffee, etc. not everyone lives within walking distance of shops
- Warburton on weekends. The exaggerated expectation that tourists have of 'Warburton Water World' thanks to social media means they come flocking. The council have neglected to dissuade tourists to visit Warburton on fire danger days even though there is the increased risk to locals and tourists with the road closure. Not to mention that this goes against all safety planning advice of 'leave early'.
- Warburton, weekends and holidays and most of summer, lack of infrastructure is a major concern.
- Airbnb's are wrecking the long term rental opportunities
- Parts of Warburton township especially along the river at weekends at public holidays. Very large groups gather and bring everything they need (not buying locally) and do not respect the local environment
- Weekend over tourism, lack of parking, Warburton Highway is down to one lane between Millgrove and Warburton, leaving a very negative impression on my friends who came to visit last week. I don't bother to go to Warburton on the weekends because of the traffic congestion, lack of parking, and attitude of unhappy and unfriendly shop owners, so I miss out on our markets and other amazing activities and shops.
- Warburton weekends and with current push for tourism it will be all week.
- The infrastructure in and around Warburton is at best, poor. It struggles to cope with the current tourist load during peak times. If an increase in tourism is implemented, infrastructure needs a major upgrade. But not at the expense of the town's beauty and charm.
- Weekends and holidays are difficult for locals. Many comment they don't go into the township of Warburton on these days. There is also a major problem with long term rentals. Locals are regularly being evicted from rentals to make way for Airbnbs. This has resulted in people having to leave, this affects schools, sporting clubs and volunteer organisations.
- Warburton, villages in Dandenong Ranges - weekends and school holidays
- There is a plan to create more useable spaces in Warburton for tourists, however in doing this I feel we will risk losing the very reason people come to visit Warburton. It's a quaint village. If the infrastructure is put in place to cope with tourism demand, it will only serve tourists and not support the locals who have chosen to call this town home. I also fear for bushfire season, or other emergency situations. The layout of the town and surrounding area will not

be able to cope with mass evacuation and panicked tourists. It shouldn't be the responsibility of volunteer firefighters to keep hundreds if not thousands of visitors safe if a natural disaster was to happen.

- Warburton. Especially weekends and public holidays. Warburton Hwy. Every day extremely busy, noisy and speed too high in Launching Place 80kms through a town that should be slowed to a safer, quieter 60km. Weekends and Public Holidays unbearably noisy, fast, very congested.
- Traffic & parking congestion a nightmare on weekends and public holidays, so many locals don't leave their homes. Mt D Tourist Rd. Parking infringements cause risks (no standing areas, Terry's Ave etc.) 1000 steps a nightmare. All the ridge townships. Tourists driving after dark a nightmare - 30km ph in 60 zones - even worse during winter as they drive home from functions & weddings. Despite new sections for bike riders, they continue to be a major problem on Mt D Tourist Rd and Mountain Hwy - not all, but many accidents caused by impatient drivers and inconsiderate bike riders 2+ abreast. Many cafes/restaurants have reduced hours already coz they can't get staff. Infrastructure is not always done to an acceptable quality - footpaths so steep most people walk on the road instead, for example. (Olinda - Range Road) and this is part of the new Ridge Walk! Inadequate attention and funding to conserve the environment - major reason to live up here and to visit. People need to value this wonderful environment rather than working out ways to make money from sending more tourists up here when you can't cope with the current numbers!
- Weekends travelling through the valley
- Warburton township, throughout the school breaks (Summer break and each term break), on weekends, on public holidays, and during events.
- During peak holiday times (Christmas/new years/Australia Day etc) there are already scores of visitors that come and have their picnics on the waterfront of the Yarra River. They bring in their own food and some eat in at Three Sugars or DT Dubs and the like. They generally ignore parking rules and will double park, park in no stopping zones, block bus stops and footpaths. Not to mention how much rubbish is left over after said visitors. I walked my dog on Christmas Night and was appalled at how much rubbish I came across. I didn't bring a big rubbish bag but could have easily filled it a few times over. I've heard other people have come across human faeces in the redwood forests in Warburton and east Warburton. They have been disgraceful towards the Ament nursing home staff when asked to remove their vehicle from the nursing home car park (its private property). The amount of rubbish dumped next to bins and along the river is disgusting and the council wants more tourists? WE CAN'T COPE WITH THE AMOUNT THAT COME ALREADY!!!!!! And then what happens when there's a bushfire and local people are trying to leave???????? We're stuck at a one way traffic light that seems to be handled by Vic roads when they feel like it?
- warburton at weekends is a disaster! The locals avoid it if possible, but we still have to deal with the litter and graffiti afterwards. Tourists are a very mixed blessing, indeed.
- Warburton water park, weekends, school holidays.
- As a local I have just learnt not to go to cafes and shops during high seasons ie weekends and holidays. It's the price you pay for living in a beautiful area. We need tourism to sustain the economy. So ...we learn to accommodate.

- Warburton Chisholm reserve and surrounds. Over crowding, insufficient toilet facilities on the north side of the river and lack of parking. This is on weekends, school holidays and any weekday when the weather is warm. Need a third bin, because on a busy day the bins fill to overflowing.
- Drive the warby hwy on the weekend! When I am trying to go about my business or get to work. There is one road into and out of warbie, bloody ridiculous on the weekend! If there is a bushfire God help us! Bring back the bloody train service!!!
- Warburton on weekends and public holidays. Give the locals the infrastructure and jobs etc they need/deserve rather than focussing on tourism to 'save' the valley. We all know how beautiful it is, that's why we choose to live here. We need jobs, parking, policing, hospitals etc etc, put residents and their needs 1st. That is your job.
- Redwoods forest and water world not enough thought into the impact of tourists by the council Only interested in Warburton
- Warburton - Friday to Sunday and school holidays. I don't even live in the tourist area however we get random people parking on nature strips and walking across land.
- Warburton township. Weekends especially summer and snow season. Due to the steep topographical nature of the area, carports are limited. Warburton does not need more tourism. The plan to build mountain bike trails is ridiculous and destructive to the Warburton community. Already people are leaving because previously existing rentals are now b and b's. The council are promoting a project that will make money for a handful of investors and provide for a niche sport in which most people are not interested. And this is why the council is destroying the uniqueness of Warburton and putting our beautiful environment at risk. Warburton does not need or want this over exploitation. Hands off Warburton!!
- Warburton water Park... and proposed bike trails. Does nothing at all for rate payers. Just floods the town with day trippers causes traffic gridlock, rubbish left and they bring their own food. Causes no access for emergency vehicles when us locals get sick.
- Warburton Sundays
- Over tourism in Warburton on Weekends and holidays
- Sometimes wineries have major concerts, and the Maroondah highway does not accommodate the traffic. Motor bike riders are also a problem when they ride in convoy especially on the Warburton Hwy. Bike riders and dirt bike riders are pushing through the bushland destroying it. Mountain bike riders have wrecked many of the trails around Silvan Dam and it is becoming dangerous to hike on the walking tracks. This is a parks issue but maybe the council could help regulate the bike riders.
- On weekends and during school holidays Warburton gets so congested that it has led to delays for ambulance services when required. It is also a major concern during bushfire season as tourists park wherever they like, making it hard to get out of town in a hurry should a fire strike
- Destroys ambience of towns
- Overtourism is a very big problem in Warburton, during the weekends it is very difficult to visit the shops, find a park, or enjoy the town. They also leave rubbish everywhere, and disrespect the beauty of the town.

- Towns such as Belgrave, Emerald, Warburton, Healesville, Olinda and Sassafras can be overcrowded and unpleasant on weekends and school holidays. A proliferation of Airbnbs in some areas impacts the rental market and quality of life for locals. I do not shop in my nearest town on weekends as parking is almost impossible. The roundabout at Belgrave is dangerous, as are some of the difficult and blind corners in the Hills.
- Warburton Highway from Lilydale to East Warburton, on weekends and holidays. The area needs to be promoted as a place to come and stay, not a day-trip destination. The removal of a public pool (funded by the community) to build a facility for tourists is offensive. Residents should have free use of facilities and tourists should pay!
- As a resident I avoid the Dandenong Ranges ridge on weekends. Shorter term parking (30 minute) is needed for locals who just need to get their prescription medicine from the chemist, for example. Visitors are often not prepared to walk any distance from their cars, it seems, and block roads around townships. More parking, destroying the rural amenity for what locals live here for, is not the answer. An on demand, mini bus type system of transporting visitors from easily accessed parking areas away from townships has been discussed for decades as a solution. The negative impact of over use of some of the national parks is evident. Footpaths are often parked on along the Tourist Road and Olinda-Monbulk Road forcing walkers onto roads. The townships are losing their aesthetic character which is a big part of what brings people here as visitors. It is becoming urbanised.
- Warburton. Esp. weekends and school holidays. Traffic jams getting in and out of town. Also at Redwoods, Donna Buang, Water park, main street and river behind shops.
- Weekends, public holidays, school holidays in Warburton. Particularly the Birrarung and Redwood. Overtourism leads to more Air b&b's or replacement of long term rental accommodation for community by short term accommodation for tourists. This degrades the community.
- Redwood Forest / weekends and school holidays
- Warburton has become a problem with overtourism, on the weekends
- Warburton water world and seville water park are always extremely busy during school holidays and on the weekends. One issue is the lack of parking and cars parking dangerously along the hwy and roads. The redwood forest, when it is accessible is the same. All public access to the river is the same and the amount of litter that is left behind, often falling into the river itself, is disgusting.
- Warburton always experiences overtourism. Worst of all at weekends. But it is something that affects the whole Yarra Valley. Warburton has always attracted hikers which is one of its strengths. The many hiking tracks need little improvement and enhance the area. But mountain bike tracks are a disaster waiting to happen - they will wreck the area. On the whole, overtourism has become so bad that visitors now need to be discouraged.
- This is a National Park and not a Melbourne Suburb - we need to keep our green spaces and reduce the human impact This survey is worded way to much in one direction - Tourism money - and stuff everything else
- Lilydale lake

- Tourism is not wanted in the Dandenong Ranges and especially not in the Sassafras area. It causes air pollution and damages the environment for plants and animals. Not only should tourism be discouraged, but there should be a programme to reduce resident dwelling numbers.
- Olinda/Sassafras hard to find parking
- Location is Warburton and adjacent areas, particularly on weekends, public and school holidays.
- Queens Park, Coronation Park and the Maroondah Dam areas are completely overrun by tourists every weekends, school holidays and on public holidays and become overcrowded, causing significant litter and pollution issues - the visitors have no respect/awareness of the natural environment and leave these areas looking like a dumping ground. Local conservation groups are overwhelmed by this activity and there appears to be no effort from Council to educate the public and change this behavior, instead they've just approved a 7 eleven, McDonalds and Bunnings - I am sad to have witnessed the deterioration of this area within my lifetime.
- Stupid tourists everywhere. Belgrave is a nightmare. In particular access to Puffing Billy. They have nowhere to cross the road at the roundabout at Burwood Hwy/Terrys Ave. It is extremely dangerous. I have people asking me all the time - Where is Puffing Billy? I have to point it out to them and watch them nearly get run over trying to cross the road. In this year of our existence, I can't believe it is still like this.
- Healesville in general. The number of tourists on the weekend AND the weekdays is ridiculous. Most people who grew up in Healesville and those residents who moved here over 10 years ago did so to avoid the busy noisy suburban areas. We are most distressed that the Yarra Ranges shire appears to be addicted to a crazy level of 'over' tourism and the general feeling from many others in the community is that we have lost our amenity of a quiet country town. We would fight against this over development however it appears that the council is deaf to our concerns.
- Unfortunately in Warburton the tourism has become a divisive issue. Our town in peak seasons/public holidays cannot accommodate the amount of traffic entering town. Parking, spaces and facilities cannot cope with those numbers. The relocation of historic buildings to make parking areas is not the answer.
- WARBURTON Highway traffic on weekends. Maroondah Highway, Melba Highway congestion pretty much all the time. Not enough parking school holidays at rainforest walk Donna Buang.
- Live outdoor "a day on the green" music events at Rochford Winery greatly inconvenience local residents who have difficulty gaining entry to their properties or travelling between Coldstream and Healesville due to long lines of traffic at the beginning and end of these events.
- Healesville is chaos most of the time. If only the main thoroughfare through town wasn't full of shops. A by-pass would not only be safer but quicker to get to the other side.
- Warburton, weekends, traffic congestion, over crowded. No parking for locals, public toilets insufficient.

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- Warburton, weekends. There are 52 weekends in a year. You are trying to change and accommodate a whole town of 104 days of the year for tourists. The government, the council can not look after what they already have let alone change a whole town to accommodate for people who don't live in warburton.
- Nicholas garden and Sherbrooke forest as well as Olinda's traffic problems
- Warburton-weekends- NO INFRASTRUCTURE=NO PARKING+NO GROWTH We are already at maximum capacity every weekend. Without parking/transport/facilities, there is NO more room for 'Growth'.
- Somewhat paradoxically it is the high volume draw card attractions - like the chocolaterie, four pillars etc
- My thoughts were that planning more tourism serious consideration is given to region/town ability to cope. Infrastructure roads etc.
- It is extremely hard to get around as the roads get very congested on weekends. The infrastructure is not great and people do not drive according to the conditions when they drive through Lilydale in particular (coming down the hill from Chirnside into Lilydale. There needs to be a greater emphasis on using public transport and making it more accessible on weekends
- More tourism means busier road. The roads of the Yarra Valley already carry more traffic than they can handle. The Melba, Maroondah and Warburton Hwy all need duplication and the intersections need to be improved. Especially between Lilydale, Yarra Glen and to Yea. Often during peak tourism times, the travel times between those towns drops significantly.
- Too many visitors to the areas
- Mainly on the weekends and during holidays
- The township of Warburton. The council has built a new water park. This has brought in more visitors to the area and the parking is appalling. There is no traffic management near the park. No safe crossing is available to people to get to the water park.
- Poorly planned development such as the water play park and its subsequent lack of parking, has destroyed the locals swimming hole behind the redwood center, the lack of bins along the river means the locals have to spend time cleaning the river front of garbage every week. While signage may help bins would be more effective, lack of knowledge about platypus areas in town may be helped with some signage too. The Warburton development plan seems to think that the answer to these things is to turn everything in to car parks, force the sports facilities to conglomerate in order to facilitate more cars, which in turn reduces the reason people come here which clearly, is the environment! And all at the expense of the people who actually live here and run things like the cfa and ses , just to name a couple. If our kids can't afford to live here when they grow up who supports the businesses that need staff? Where do they live? In the air bnb's? What a joke
- Warburton, summer holidays, school holidays, public holidays.
- Seville Waterpark during school holidays is overcrowded .. there was a indoor pool planned to be built at the Seville reserve along the lines of Yarra Junction Sports Centre but it was quietly

dumped. Parking at the Waterpark is not satisfactory during these busy times and crossing Monbulk Seville rd is dangerous.

- Rochford events constrain amenity for locals (eg.travel delays), pedestrian access along Main St, lack of appropriate infrastructure organised to support new...primarily tourism 'destination'... facilities eg Four Pillars Healesville, Warburton Water Park and the remedy impacts negatively on community amenity.
- Council has made areas such as Healesville and Warburton difficult for business owners to increase there businesses to allow growth. Council is negative to business ideas.
- Warburton Water world - inadequate parking, dangerous u-turns by visitors, walking across roads and expecting traffic to stop for them, not waiting for traffic to pass, observing how nearby residents have to barricade their own driveways. Times: warm and hot days. Warburton Main Street. Unable to get parking place to pick up mail from post office - a mail delivery to the house would be nice. Weekend double parking, driving at 60% under the speed limit. Stopping on the crest of the road at the entry to the town just to look for a parking place, the constant 'swinging open of doors into moving traffic, poor truck drivers! and the rest of us.
- All Weekends during school holidays. Public holidays. Summer Weekends weather dependant Warburton next to water park and Warburton township on open ground next to river particularly near the main shopping area
- -The school numbers are all dropping. Every single one of them in Upper Yarra. When we moved out here they were all almost double the numbers they have nowZ it is so sad!! -There are no rentals so families are moving out of the area. Too many have been turned into air bnb's to accommodate tourists instead of locals -No way to get out of there is a bushfire as there is only 1 road in and out of Warburton -Not enough parking for visitors, however, too much more parking will ruin the look and natural feel of the town -Weekends and holidays is impossible to find a park in town. -Tourists leave rubbish at the river even with bins nearby. Locals spend Monday mornings cleaning the river bank. East Warburton doesn't even have rubbish bins meaning it is disgusting after a weekend. I have my little Family day Care children cleaning up the area every week. (as well as the bus stop that is usually littered with Mac Donald's rubbish)
- In general the Yarra valley is getting to busy but mostly am worried about Warburton and what the future holds for that beautiful town I love to visit but over tourism already starting to impact me wanting to visit.
- As a resident who often forgets that they live within/very near to a tourist destination, I can make the mistake of heading up to the local shops/coffee shop's etc on the weekend. It truly is a shock to see car jams, people walking all over the roads without any sense. The question about bicyclists has not been asked - this is a major headache on the roads every day of the week, but weekends it is crazy. Bikes racing cars, cars weaving around bikes, tourists having no idea and driving 30 kms an hour/i've even seen them do a U-turn in the middle of the tourist road. We do get an increase in litter in the parks/tracks in the hills - I can't speak for everywhere.
- weekends & school holidays in warburton. its why i moved out of warburton

- For residents living in rural areas of the Shire tourism leads to more pressure and problems such as loud noise into the night, vehicle traffic, visual pollution (especially lights at night times impacting on people/wildlife), pressure to build on hills obstructing views, creating lights etc. Parking in places like Warburton is sometimes impossible-council refuses to care about this....cafes full etc...all this may be OK for tourists but clearly not wanted by residents and why they live here in the first place. So whats the plan...just continue to increase night time activities, grow wineries, increase tourism , increase traffic and bugger the local environment and livability of the Shire??
- Warburton weekends due to a lack of visitor parking. Public toilets are an issue.
- Weekends in Warburton
- I live in Healesville and it is horrific on weekends. Too dangerous to ride my bike or walk or even go to the shops. I have to pick up multiple bags of rubbish that they throw out their windows too. Don't get me started on the dead wildlife they mow down in their cars. Leave light shows for the city thanks
- Illegal car parking at Warburton Splash Park. Traffic jams on High Fire Danger days. Trash and rubbish littering the river reserves after long weekends/public holiday tourists.
- Lilydale, into the Yarra Valley. Traffic is a really big issue, a bypass is necessary. Easter weekend is especially busy.
- Redwood forest especially weekends and holidays, parking and litter is a huge problem Warburton town in general at weekends and holidays, the inconsiderate behaviour of tourists, driving, parking and littering issues This area is a huge fire risk area and out of Towners do not understand risks, come and set up burners to cook food in very dangerous conditions...don't understand the effect of wind.
- Weekends near the redwood forest in Warburton.
- Increase infrastructure so locals also get a benefit it seems all focus is on tourism and locals are forgotten
- All of Warburton and the Warburton Highway and also Monbulk and it's major roads every weekend with decent weather and public holidays school holidays at cetera
- Warburton on weekends and school holidays, and Dandenong Ranges tourist towns at the same times.
- Warburton Main Street,Thomas avenue, weekends, school holidays
- Warburton - Weekends, public holidays. Locals are squeezed out of Warburton by the huge influx of tourists that are in numbers that are too large for the township to deal with. Locals are better off travelling to Yarra Junction, Woori Yallock Seville or Lilydale for their needs.
- Weekends, long-weekends, and school holidays there are so many people coming to Warburton and they leave rubbish everywhere!! There are a bunch of locals who walk around each morning picking up rubbish because the council doesn't seem to care but we can't always stop it from going in the river... so much for caring about the platypus. It's the most disappointing thing about living in this beautiful part our country.
- Mt Dandenong especially weekends.
- Healesville and surrounds during school holidays and weekends

- Warburton...anytime of the day/week
- Warburton is a congestion nightmare on weekends & public/school holidays. Tourism is being pushed at a cost to the local community. Community voice is not being heard to maintain what makes the area special & tourists don't care how the area is treated as long as they can park as close to their destination as possible
- Warburton cannot deal with the traffic that comes through as it is. If there was a bushfire, we would all be stuck with only 1 road out and so many cars. !! The school numbers are dramatically dropping as all the private rentals are becoming air bnbs. There is rubbish left everywhere along river banks in both Warburton and East Warburton and left for locals to clean up There is not enough car parks, yet to create more would destroy the natural beauty of the area. Tourism is great but too much is destroying the town!!
- In Warburton weekends, holidays and school holiday periods are extremely busy with the town nearing capacity creating challenges with parking and traffic. The continual marketing of Warburton only further exacerbates these challenges. The geographic limitations of Warburton (ie narrow valley with single lane highway access) should be weighed when trying to encourage more people to visit. We really need park and ride transportation options to minimise/reduce the amount of vehicles cruising the current Warburton main parking areas. Further developing the very limited free space in Warburton into more car parking will not only alter the country feel of the town but would only encourage more cars to drive to Warburton thereby making matters even worse. Warburton is considered to be one of the highest fire danger areas in Victoria and enticing an unlimited number of tourists to Warburton seems very irresponsible. The development of an effective Emergency Management Plan, Traffic Management Plan and Access Management Plan should be undertaken before any further tourism projects are approved to ensure we can adequately safeguard the community if a bushfire were to endanger the Warburton area.
- Bike riders slow down roads and no parking in Belgrave
- Warburton is awful on the weekends. Overcrowded, not enough parking leading to people parked halfway out on the highway and causing even more traffic issues than we have already, and the whole waterpark situation is disgusting. People doing illegal 3 point U turns in the middle of the highway Infront of incoming traffic. Someone will end up seriously injured, or worse . It would be nice if some more people actually came through Yarra Junction and Wesburn and supported the local businesses there instead of being turned off the highway by their gps to go straight to Warburton via the back road. No one even knows Yarra Junction has decent shops or cafes.
- Every weekend we struggle to even find a car park to be able to shop locally so we have to shop out of town, most effected areas are from Yarra junction to Warburton and that's mostly affected on weekends only during the week it's quiet enough for locals tourism is great for the area and we love local buisness owners reaping the rewards but parking in general is a massive issue spending on money on the look of shop fronts doesn't fix the massive pot holes or the lack of parking
- Olinda and Sassafras parking availability
- Warburton on long weekends and public holidays. Main reason currently being the Warburton Waterworld on any hot day. In winter same occurs when there is snow on Mt Donna Buang.

Hopefully the over crowding occurring with Redwood Forest will get sorted with better amenities.

- Referring to Warburton & over tourism is mainly during weekends, public holidays & events
- Generally need to be mindful of the impact of tourism on the natural environment especially state and national forests eg introduction of invasive plant species, rubbish and adverse effect on wildlife.
- Warburton is being ruined by tourists. Mess, destroying trees, increased crime
- Healesville main street on weekends. Specifically Sunday afternoons. With everyone coming home from out of town is using healesville as a 'go through' and stopping for diving breaks, traffic is a nightmare. Locals can't even go to the shops or get a park when they do manage to get across Maroondah Hwy.
- Warburton weekends holidays festive. Marysville the same and Monbulk.
- The Maroondah Highway through Lilydale to Healesville is always a traffic jam, same as Victoria Road through to Yarra Glen, way too dangerous and congested
- Weekends in summer clegg Rd is too busy. Lots of accidents at the corner of clegg Rd an warrigal rd
- I find with surveys the short answer selection doesn't allow to answer properly, I have put why I mentioned areas if that is in another section coming up I apologise. Weekends, school holidays and summertime. Warburton, redwood forest is a nightmare (no toilets, inadequate parking and too much traffic, I hear local residents complaining about this regularly and the pool in Warburton.) Parking, toilet facilities THE ROADS (the Rd into Warburton has lights to get people through as it's unsafe from landslide which is A priority issue without the extra people) ONE HWY IN AND OUT NEEDING UPGRADING. DANGEROUS INTERSECTIONS eg. CRN OF WARBURTON HWY AND GEMBROOK RD. (Not just from accidents, local residents NEED a safe crossing on BUSY HWY to get to and from bus stops, walking track and local shops YARRA JUNCTION has ONE crossing with lights, so many people don't walk up to light intersection to cross the HWY, it's either too far or in a hurry etc. so they cross close to the corner in front of mall and shops which makes it dangerous in peak times and in general, they have events at the oval and markets, swimming pool, kids crossing HWY at skateboard ramp section. The supermarket has pokey small carpark which is inadequate which is an issue for locals without the influx of tourists. People can't afford their already unjustified rate hikes being continually expected to pay and not be able to use or get around their towns from too many tourists coming, leaving rubbish and shitting the woods as theres no toilets (and this is actually happening). Tourists help local business yes although not enough infrastructure to accommodate as it is now and we live in a beautiful country area and don't want it turned into all about just to make more money, we always try to buy local to support local business and we're not against tourists in the valley and fed up with councils over charging rates and their outrageous salaries.
- 1000 Steps, Sassafra and Olinda parking nightmare esp.weekends, school holidays, public holiday. Sassafra Post Office parking is almost inaccessible to locals. Reversing cars across double lines on dangerous bend diag.opposite 1000 Steps exit - these are constantly parking "nose-in" on the not-observed/not-policed signed "parallel" parking zone. Tremont petrol station Mt Dandenong Tourist Road (opposite Churchill Drive corner) Very Dangerous

exit-entry as sign Exit Only sign has not been erected. Should be 40-50kph speed limit along Churchill Drive - almost fortnightly deaths of little wallabies struck by speeding vehicles. Lyrebirds regularly across this road. There are now very obvious Feral Deer hazard signs but non-locals need Lyrebirds/Wallabies warning signs with a lowered speed limits.

- Olinda on the weekend gets congested with tourists making it difficult for locals to enjoy their regular haunts... not too mention impatient drivers. Many of the beautiful walks tracks in Sherbrooke have people leaving behind their rubbish.
- Warrandyte on weekends
- We now choose not to go into Warburton on a weekend as it is overcrowded with tourists. This affects our living standards as my partner works and we used to enjoy a coffee and or meals out in our local town on the weekends 😞 😞
- Healesville used to be a nice quiet town to live in but now, it is so overrun by tourists all weekend, every weekend, public holidays and school holidays. It is difficult to find parking on a Saturday morning when I need to go about my business. The tourists have complete disregard for the rules, they turn across double solid lines and park wherever they want to. There is insufficient parking for the large numbers that visit here.
- Warrandyte...only one road in and out (in FOUR DIRECTIONS) and limited parking . THIS IS EXTRAORDINARIOUSLY PROBLEMATIC in fire season. 24/7
- Warrandyte....traffic is a problem, particularly during summer. Fire danger area & poor traffic exits makes it a dangerous place in summer. Too many visitors ignore parking restrictions on narrow roads, as many people want to go to the river. Warrandyte usually has some drownings in the river each summer because people are ignorant of the dangers when swimming in a river.
- No not really
- Both weekends and school holidays in Warburton
- Not some much overtourism more 'overdevelopment' in Eltham/Eltham North which would greatly impact tourism encouragement i.e extreme traffic congestion, car parking etc
- School holidays - Christmas and Easter. Long weekends especially but all weekends with fine weather and in the snow season too. It is crazy on sweltering hot , fire danger days due to Waterworld and the Yarra River. Spruiking Waterworld is insane considering we are a high fire danger area. Places that suffer from too high a concentration of tourists include Warburton Highway, Dammans Road, La La Falls, the river banks, the main street and the RailTrail. Very uncomfortable for tourists while locals have stopped using these areas in tourist times. For those that work and have no other option but mainstream holidays, it is even worse. Many locals holiday elsewhere just to escape the crowds. The WMBD will destroy Warburton as a residential area and will also destroy some sections of our community that will not be compatible with a dominant culture of mountain bikers - eg our arts community. The fact our main gallery space is being offered up for a co-tenancy for any business interest, not having to use it as an arts space is proof of the council's attitude to the arts. Really poor. Lower the rent instead of building all this tourist infrastructure in a town so obviously completely unable to expand to accommodate the tourists you are trying to attract due to the one narrow road in and out and the steep mountains to the north and south of this narrow valley. Jobs are important but tourism is a small part of our local employment- education and health care are

our biggest - those jobs will be lost. I am so sick of hearing this jobs jobs jobs mantra when the WMBDs own social impact says that jobs created by tourism's and those employed in these jobs will not be able to afford to live here. It's not a local job to the person working in it if they don't live here. We are filling up with holiday homes and bnbs and that is the government's choice - it is not inevitable, it's planned. There is no provision for housing for the low income people anymore - it is even getting hard for those on moderate incomes.

- Over tourism in relation to Yarra Junction, Wesburn through to Warburton. Living on the highway we observe all the increased traffic as a result of tourists and even with locals leaving for work and returning home in the evenings. Majority not obeying the speed limits. Constant burnouts, speeding, unnecessary use of engine breaks (trucks), revving of vehicles etc, especially along station road and onto the highway – Wesburn. This occurs generally Wednesday's through to Sundays at all hours of the day and night. When you call police to report, nothing gets done. At times it takes 15-20 minutes to even have an opportunity to pull out of own driveway, not to mention the horrible state of the roads and highway. Disgusting .
- The new Water Park in Warburton there should be a limit per day. Locals now never visit it with their families. It was built for local families planned by school children and rarely do any of them have the use of it. Overcrowded, not enough parking in the area . Even with the use of the Redwood Grounds parking over the river. Tourists out of town still try parking in areas marked NO PARKING. Should have a council traffic officer FINE a few for illegal parking. The park can be used by local children after school or those who love Basketball and Tennis can go and play on the new courts during the week or ride their bikes up early to play tennis or basket ball. This is great. Play Groups during Term time also use the Play park and Water Park in the Summer. Winter can be another nightmare for locals if there is snow on Mount Donna Buang. Again there should be a limit going up the mountain. Signs saying Mount Donna Buang Full. Again many locals don't go up due to crowds. City drivers have no idea how to drive on country roads especially around mountains. They also think they can park anywhere when they can't find a legal park. It's a beautiful place to live but if a limit should be made daily as to how many come to some of the Venues and make sure there is enough Parking for all new ones . Toilets need to be provided in all areas and note not only dogs on leash but PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOGS.!!! Provide more Water Parks around the perimeter of the Yarra Valley and Ranges for all the tourists coming up at weekends from the other side of Melbourne or Inner Melbourne. Tourists are a must for our Businesses and a shame if people can't visit our lovely areas but the masses that are coming make it impossible for locals to go to any local areas during weekends with their kids and families or even shop on these days. Locals tell their families down the line. Don't bother trying to come in the high tourist times. Not sure what can be done seriously except charge to come to some tourist areas or time parking. ie 3 hours max. So there is a turn over. But then you need to have Parking Attendants. Anyway glad I don't have to make all the decisions. I believe council at present are doing the best they can with what finances you have. Thanks.
- Main Street In Olinda, every Sunday. It's absolute chaos, there is nowhere to park. If the locals want to pop down to the shops to grab a coffee and pie, they just don't bother
- Overtourism makes some of our towns practically inaccessible for locals on weekends and school holidays. Lack of knowledge of local roads can make driving risky and a lack of parking means that I often have to travel to less visited areas to obtain goods and services.

- Parts of Warburton are seeing an influx of large groups of tourists at weekends and public holidays who do not respect the local environment. I love to see families and groups enjoying the beautiful surroundings by the river but we need to have better management of these heavily visited spots. These groups bring all their own food etc and do not shop locally
- Warburton is just too crazy at weekends and during any public holiday period due to overtourism . There are too many day visitors coming for all the free activities then leave their rubbish behind or wild toileting along the pristine waterways, parking over residents driveways, picnicing on private property we could go on and on. It needs to stop and this council needs to step up and look after our community before tourists and especially before promoting the area for more people to visit.
- Warburton is a Disneyland with free facilities for the day trippers.They come use the facilities, leave their rubbish and park wherever they like. Council should concentrate more on better services for the residents who actually pay their wages, need to fix local roads and their potholes, clean up the entrance to Yarra Junction which is a eyesore and a disgrace.
- Warburton Water Park Parking
- over tourism is a major problem in Warburton. We have a single lane of traffic exiting and entering due to road damage it takes too long to be able to exist and enter Warburton, is there was an emergency situation such as a bushfire there is no plan on how everyone would be able to get out of Warburton. This seems clearly to be all about greed and money, there is no proper thought about the community. There is not enough parking spaces to allow for the tourist. They are littering and wrecking the natural beauty of the land. When building the water park for the tourist there was no car park built yet cars are parked all up the road and kids were walking across the busy highway to get the the water park. Tourist were parking in Yrec the business complex for the local small business. When council was approving the wellspring place they had people watching everyday to make sure there was enough parking so they could approve it, they did not allow the Warburton bakery to open inside for eating because there was not enough parking to accommodate for the extra people but with the water park they approved it with pretty much no parking. Because it's all about greed and where they can make there money.
- Warburton. Weekends, public holidays, school holidays
- Warburton. Esp. weekends and school holidays. I avoid going in to town on weekends as there are traffic jams and I struggle to find a car park. Loss of amenity due to overwhelming tourist numbers and fractured community due to proliferation of Air B n B's. Congestion at Redwoods, water park, main street and land slip traffic lights (getting in and out of town).
- Warburton is an absolute debacle on a weekend and public holidays and now with the WUD and place plan to facilitate the mountain bike destination the place will be overrun with tourists who will require
- Healesville- weekends Dandenong ranges - weekends Yarra valley chocolaterie- weekends
- Public holidays - everyone arriving for an event at the same day - last Tulip festival - roads and parking terrible. Day on the green events - need better traffic management. These large events need to be hosted with the local access in mind to get to work or get home etc
- Every weekend it is so hard to cross maroondah hwy at Coldstream, we cannot get out safely and often have near misses just getting out onto the road. We as locals cannot access the

trail or pump track as you cannot take kids across the road safely. The traffic from from healsville mixed with the Yarra Glen access creates a constant flow with no safe gaps for anyone in Coldstream.

- Puffing Billy Station area - Pedestrian traffic contributes to increased risk for cars. Lack of parking space for patrons and driver behaviour extremely frustrating at times. Ferntree Gully National Park area can be very busy on the weekends. Sassafras / Olinda precincts on the weekends can be challenging to navigate.
- Sassafras, Olinda Weekends, holidays

- Weekends in Healesville. I love that the town is buzzing but tend to stay away on weekends. Extra parking would be a huge help as I don't mind the people, it's just the traffic and parking. As well as litter on really busy weekends.
- Tulip festival, last year bumper to bumper traffic from tulip farm to past Monbulk, all roads blocked for nearly 5klms and more in all directions from the farm if you were able to go to Monbulk or Seville you were never getting home. Rediculous traffic that posed are serious threat if emergency vehicles needed access or you needed to get to an emergency Department. Police should have turned people away to ensure roads were clear. Poor traffic management.
- Warburton at the weekend is already overcrowded. As a former resident for 20 years (now in Yarra Junction) I tried to avoid going g i to the town at the weekends. It is just awful
- Weekends & special events & holiday times cause traffic congestion & overcrowding of facilities & the environment. It spoils the beauty of the area if everywhere are people & cars. It's like being in a busy suburb but there's mountains in the background. The look & atmosphere of this area will get overrun if there are more car parks & people. Such a shame for it to happen
- Weekend traffic mainly , trying to get out onto Maroondah highway is very difficult from local roads .
- Public transport services don't exist to many of the high quality places in our region. Therefore people can only access by car causing congestion issues all over. le redwood forest has no parking. The entire mountain has poor parking .
- Roads
- On weekends the Warburton highway is so busy with traffic it can make it feel very unsafe
- ju
- Warrandyte on weekends is impossible to access because of too many tourists hence no parking to frequent our local restaurants.

Q15b You indicated that a local issue that needed to be prioritised was "public toilets". Could you please tell us more.

- We've recently had a new, automated toilet block installed in Emerald near the Hills Hub – this is a great location and service. The same is needed at the Puffing Billy Playground down the other end of town because lots of people I know dislike using those toilets as they are often

very dirty and unkept. I also think toilets like this at Emerald Lake Park would be beneficial too.

- There should be more public toilets in high traffic areas. the new(ish) ones in Olinda are a great example, and should be replicated in Kallista, Sassafras, Belgrave, Monbulk ect.
- Not great condition
- They need to be upgraded.
- There are not where enough public toilets for the amount of beverages consumed and the distance to travel across the valley
- Cleanliness at Lilydale Lake
- Generally, our villages are a disgrace and our area an embarrassment. When you compare the area to other regional type places, eg Gisbon, Daylesford, we are 30 years behind. These areas have gone ahead so much in the last ten years and we have actually gone backwards. The area is daggy and dated, the mountain ash forest trees are dangerous and deter people from coming, they don't want to be crushed when limbs fall. Our nature is beautiful but inaccessible, walking paths are unkempt, weeds everywhere, and generally unsafe to walk on. When it comes to our shops and restaurants, well don't get me started. Frankly, it is depressing to live in an area where so many places open, go bust, and the properties sit empty. Look at the House of Frs, in Sassafras, waiting to open for two years. Look at the Sassafras Tavern, what is happening there. So many empty places, that it is terrible for your mental health. Look at Sky High, they serve deep fried rubbish to burn tourists and don't care at all. There are no decent places to buy fresh fruit and veg or decent meat, or a decent deli. People in Melbourne shun our area and I don't blame them. I moved up here eight years ago, thinking the area would go ahead, what a mistake I made. Personally I cannot wait to leave. Do not believe the area will ever change.
- More public toilet facilities and keeping them clean
- There needs to be ample clean public toilets around the region.
- While public toilets may be available, cleanliness all through out Covid needs to be prioritised.
- Ensure facilities available in all tourism visitor locations, and with adequate daily cleaning and management
- More public toilet facilities needed in more places.
- Need more cleaning
- MANY AREAS HAVE INADEQUATE FACILITIES, IE ,SASSAFRAS,FERNY CREEK,ETC
- Public toilets for redwoods
- There are none anywhere near the Belgrave south Main Street. The ones in Belgrave are disgusting & on public display
- Not enough. No changing places facilities. Poorly designed.
- Keep clean
- Upkeep of public toilets in many parts of the Valley is sadly lacking

- The two sets of public toilets in Monbulk are not cleaned or maintained well enough for people to use
- With an aging population there needs to be toilets that are clean, well lit and open over a wide range of hours. Some of those maintained eg by Parks Vic are atrocious.
- This will always be an issue as more tourism and use of public toilets requires more contractor involvement with cleaning and maintenance.
- More required
- Need to increase availability of public toilets and the quality of service/cleanliness. Visitors need access to facilities and local business do not always accommodate to public toilets need to be easily accessible.
- Clean public toilets are important
- Good quality public toilets are essential! No-one wants to use one of those awful stainless exceloos that play music. they are horrid
- We need clean, world class toilets (think public toilets in Japan). No smelly toilets.
- There is very few toilets and they are not clean
- People will defacate when they need to. When there are inadequate public toilets they do it in the bush. Already a problem in places such as Warburton.
- PROVISION IS GENERALLY GOOD
- There are none in our town. No sewage or mains water so no one wants to pay to build public toilets. Have to go to other towns to find public toilets open some of the time. Not 24 hour toilets around
- No
- Access to public toilets at high traffic areas
- Often hard to find
- Maintenance seems to take a long time. Clear signage.
- Only 2 public toilets in Healesville
- they are unusable
- Cyclists piss "behind" the bus stop near us. Cyclists pee "behind" trees in our court.
- They aren't signed and are often very dirty and lacking soap and paper
- They need an upgrade
- Queens Park and town centre public toilets are always messy and dirty
- There does not seem to be enough public toilets when there is an influx of visitors. Roads need up grading as they are crumbling and pot holes everywhere.
- Public toilets in the area are a few & far between & often in a state unfit for use. Broken fixtures. Dirty
- More public toilets needed

- People are lazy, I have witnessed too many people (often foreign) shitting in the river while there are swimmers around.
- I think they're important and generally good. Sadly some places in towns such as Healesville have facilities damaged and fouled which is distressing to see. Not sure how to address crimes such as vandalism. In my experience council has been good at responding
- Working on the rail trail we had human excrement all over the back of our shop constantly because there are no public toilets in places where people need them if you look at other rail trails in Victoria they all have solar powered water tank operated toilets and horse yards and other facilities that ovals simply does not
- Wesburn Warburton need infrastructure built to handle new tourist attractions and tourism in general, not enough is being done before promotion of the area and critical infrastructure relied on by locals is failing also the congestion of the town creates a fire safety issue
- Sick of people going to the toilet public areas on the side of the road and at the back of people's houses it's disgusting
- The public toilets are dirty smelly and have undesirables hanging around. There are also not enough bins. Lilydale is just not "clean".
- Clean public toilets. We have travelled a lot and the Yarra Valley does not have enough easy access to public toilets that are always clean
- Not enough, and those that are around are not maintained well and dirty - Belgrave, Upwey - nil in Tecoma, Birdland - shocking
- Toilets on green street can be odiferous at times. Other option at the walk, shut and locked up. Other options are to go into a cafe.
- More are needed and they need to be kept cleaner
- Public toilets in the redwood forest, which I believe are already on the cards. Also another public toilet at the IGA end of Warburton would be nice.
- Toilets are often filthy and have vagrants who use them as defacing locations or meeting spots
- The only public toilets in Healesville's commercial Centre are in green street & queens park (better signage is required) as a number of cafe's either don't have toilet facilities or allow their customers to use them! the Yarra Ranges planning dept is failing.
- I have seen people relieving themselves on the walking track and side of the highway. Not the nicest thing to see
- Every town should have at least 1 public toilet
- Clean and easily accessible toilets are necessary for locals and tourists
- The public toilets in Olinda , Sassafrass and Sherbrooke forest are a disgrace and disgusting
- Public toilets that are upgraded and well maintained
- The Monbulk public toilets are revolting!

- Hard to find at local parks - Margaret lewis reserve
- There are too few toilet facilities in the area-
- With the amount of tourism you want we need more public toilet facilities instead of using residential gardens etc
- Essential for visitors to have toilet facilities accessible. In particular coach loads of visitors. Locate at a central site "Welcome to The Yarra Valley & Dandeniong ranges"
- As a seasoned traveller, I believe that public toilets need to be clean, accessible and obvious. Although there are public toilets in the main street of Belgrave, they are amongst shops and I think they are difficult for international tourists to find.
- If increase amount of visitors to area then clean and sufficient numbers of toilets need to be available and accessible for all.
- the only public toilets are located in Sassafras or Olinda, yet the Ridgewalk is a long trek with no other toilets...
- It is good we have public toilets in most townships in Yarra Ranges and important they remain
- Not all locations have readily accessible toilets. Young children and older adults can't 'hang on' as long as young adults. I am assuming there must be some 'standard' as to how far a person should walk in search for a toilet. Looking online I found 400 metres or 4 to 10 minutes mentioned (https://wollongong.nsw.gov.au/__data/assets/pdf_file/0020/138125/Public-Toilet-Strategy-2019-2029.PDF) I regularly go walking with a U3A group and find that I and others often have to head bush because of a lack of toilets nearby. If you walk from Grant's Picnic Ground and do a loop that takes you up to Grantulla Road there are no public toilets available. There also needs to be public toilets on the far side of Lilydale Lake. Have public toilets been factored in to the RidgeWalk development? The existing public toilets are not always open e.g, Mt Dandenong Observatory - during the week you have to use the toilets at the restaurant which doesn't open until 10am. Other areas needing toilets include: - Mount Dandenong Arboretum, - Valley Picnic Ground, - Birdsland - locations could include Dargon Track / Logan Park Rd junction area (would service Lysterfield Lake and Birdsland), Granite Track Summit (Birdsland) and Trig Point Lookout (Lysterfield Lake). I realize that some of these locations are not in the Shire but they could be mentioned in discussions with Parks Victoria and the State government. - the many linear reserves with walking trails e.g. Sassafras Creek Linear Reserve, Warburton Rail Trail - other areas with large carparks. Often there are not enough toilets e.g. playgrounds; particularly if some are out of action for any reason. There also needs to be signage indicating where toilets are and the distance to them.
- Currently only limited provision in Sherbrooke area Evidence of public use of forest for toileting No clear indication of the location of public toilets
- Must be maintained everywhere due to public health infection control.
- Not enough. NOT CLEAN ENOUGH
- There doesn't seem to be enough
- We live in Don Valley and have four children, we are always looking for a toilet with children. Our options can be too long inbetween especially when visting local bakery and vegie shop

we normally have to drive to Launching place for a toilet stop . The warburton trail really has little toilet stops along the way that aren't business related either.

- Toilets need to be in areas where there are many tourists gathering along the River. ie beside Advent Care Nursing Home. Huge family groups gather everyweekend there. No facilities ofr them and no rubbish bins. Also Council signs should say Dogs on leash at all times around town and ADD Please pick up after you dog.Carry a Doggie bag?????
- There are not a lot of public toilets around and in winter they are often very wet and the toilet paper is always wet. Always very dirty, I normally just go home to use the bathroom.
- It's always essential to have clean, safe usable public ammenties available at as many locations as possible.
- Clean modern toilets at all towns needed
- There are public toilets in Olinda and Kalorama memorial park and also Kalorama park which are terrible and unhygienic. The toilets at Kalorama reserve are the worst I've seen and are an embarrassment. There is no roof , steel toilets with no seats and don't seem to ever be cleaned.
- Heaseville area and Yarra Glen
- There are insufficient public toilets in certain areas of the town.
- There are some public toilets around Sherbrook forest walking trails and local villages, however, some of them are still closed since the lockdowns or in extremely poor conditions. Besides the overall number and localities of these toilets are not sufficient for the number of people visiting the area. This situation inclines desperate tourists to go into bushes to relieve themselves, causing littering with human biowaste, toilet or other paper and other materials alike.
- Public facilities are so few and far between, even in urban centres. If the plan is to increase tourism, roadside bathrooms and more facilities in urban areas really need to be established
- There aren't enough toilets to meet peak demands in Warburton, and especially on the Aquaduct walking track people just go wherever because there are no facilities at all.
- Upwey toilets are horrible.
- Some places which are highly used don't have them and people use the bush instead.
- Having clean easily accessible local amenities like toilets reflect better on the local area increasing enjoyment of visitors and encouraging them to explore and support local attractions.
- They are required
- Need to be clean and have hand washing facilities etc.
- No public toilets near Kalorama
- I am very aware of the availability of public toilets due to Incontinence issues and find moving around the Valley a little stressful at times.
- Not enough of them
- Important to have clean accessible well sign posted toilets in every town

- Visitors often judge towns by the accessibility, cleanliness etc of their public toilets. If you are to encourage non vehicle movement (eg walking etc) of visitors, toilets need to be within a walk distance for MOST visitors. Currently not case. Mt Dandenong has no toilets. Olinda toilets need (better) lighting inside. Monbulk toilets, esp the ones in Woolworths carpark are a 'don't come back' experience.
- Signage mainly to indicate access to toilets
- Too many people, not enough public toilets.
- No or not enough public toilets in tourist attractions, especially in Mount Dandenong
- There is one set of public toilets in Olinda and none in Mount Dandenong, Sassafras, Kalorama. The Olinda ones are messy and there are no lights at night
- There don't seem to be many.
- The management of tourists, especially during peak times is very poor. When compared to the Mornington peninsula, the volume cannot be managed and there is nowhere for people to go. Public facilities are lacking and poorly resourced and with many small businesses being family run, unfortunately they do not cater or are unavailable during peak times. It's frustrating to have visitors during holiday periods like Christmas and have everywhere closed or completely booked out. There literally isn't even take away available in Upwey, Belgrave, Tecoma over the Christmas period every single year. I've lived here 16 years and it's been the same every year.
- Not enough public toilets
- there not many around
- Because the few that are available are not pleasant. Need nice modern toilets with disabled facilities. It's a no brainer that visitors need good availability to decent toilets.
- Public toilets Monbulk
- The toilets in the area are dated and limited. They need cleaning more often and upgrading. There isn't enough of them around either.
- more accessible bathrooms for families and those with disability - like changing place bathrooms
- Upgrade to Wesburn toilets, more accessible toilets along the rail trail. Difficult to access public toilets from rail trail
- Visitors to the region have few facilities like this.
- All gender toilets More availability of public toilets, particularly given number of winery tours in the area
- Old people now are the ones with money to spend, they go to the toilets a lot. Need change rooms for kids. Toilets need to be clean also. You want people to return, tell others, everything needs to be perfect. There is a great venue in Lilydale but due to poor toilets we just don't go there any more.
- More public toilets needed in the Warburton area particularly as number of visitors increase
- All visitor sites should have clean public toilets.

- In a few natural areas I have seen human waste just off the path. The Redwood Forest has a big issue with this. I know new facilities are going in there so I am am very happy about that. Dog poo around Lilydale lake is a big problem. I know there are plenty of bins and bags available but disrespectful people still leave dog waste around. I've heard of DNA testing in other parts of the world, could that be possible here? The Warburton trail also has this problem.
- More locations
- Every body needs a toilet during a visit
- I think this speaks for itself. Availability of public toilets, and prioritising their cleanliness should be a priority for all tourism destinations.
- I've never seen any apart from Olinda playspace.
- If you don't have clean toilets with toilet paper, hand wash etc. People will not return or recommend to others. Even worse they will say don't go there.
- There is a lack of toilets, the current ones need upgrading, there are no family or disabled change rooms and toilets m, they are rarely cleaned
- Healesville main Street - access ok for pedestrians, hard for drivers as parking was far away
- People walking the Warburton track need them plus they also need to be managed and clean regularly
- We need more clean facilities.
- Does a bear sh#t in the woods? Tourists do!
- There's no enough toilets
- Existing facilities need modernising and baby changing facilities introduced to prevent dumping of dirty nappies
- We have very few public facilities that are easily accessible to people with disabilities.
- Currently not enough toilets in the villages, and old toilets need upgrading
- Quality and number needs an increase
- More public toilets at local towns.
- Many people are using open spaces in Warburton to picnic ie. near the Nursing home. There are no toilets nearby and it's been reported there are people using nearby bushes.
- Clean and well serviced and signposted toilets important everywhere
- The public toilets in the Lilydale area need to be cleaned more often
- Keeping toilets clean and well stocked with supplies during peak tourist times, particularly if an event is held
- There are parks that don't have public toilets.
- There are no public toilets at the belgrave Borthwick park and the toilets in the Main Street are gross!
- Have you ever been to the Sassafras public toilets behind the hall??????

- Ensure they are better maintained
- The one coming into Warburton is very poorly sign listed The other toilets are difficult to access with limited parking
- If you road trip you always need a pit stop
- Condition of toilets and cleanliness reflects on visitor and local's experience. Often there is not enough or not clean
- People sh*t in the bushes. We need more toilets and make them more easily accessible
- condition of public toilets has improved over the last few years, but is still not good. More rubbish bins would help. It is not uncommon to find babies' nappies and sanitary items on the floor; wet floors; no toilet paper.
- Provisions nequiiired for redwood forests.
- They need to be cleaned more regulsrly
- Yes, more public toilets in areas I've sassafras.
- For visitors visiting Warburton and utilising areas on the north side of the river, many times men have been seen urinating in the trees because the toilets on the south side are "Too Far"
- Tourist = public toilets thought that would be obvious.
- More of them and better mainted
- Not enough public toilets, they are uncomfortable and they are not cleaned often enough
- They are embarrassing. Put in proper toilets would want to use. They feel like you would fine current ones in bush camp settings not in the middle of town.
- Redwood forest,
- We need more of them in Warburton
- They are disgusting
- They're clearly aren't enough as tourists go in the bushes and leave toilet paper all over the place (often see this along the river behind main street). Toilets aren't cleaned regularly enough. Glad to finally see soap in some of them now.
- No toilets at redwoods forest or along the trail
- Warburton has a number of public toilets, but as the town developments, it may require some more. Through summer there are many people by the river - they often need access to toilets and if there isn't anything around they just go in the bushes. Where there are large groups of people enjoying nature, and not cafes etc. there needs to be toilets
- Nappies left on the grass on the banks of the Yarra near Advent care
- When town is busy there are not enough. Also some of the day visitors go in the river , along the river banks etc.
- Very limited in warburton
- The Warburton Trail could do with toilets at all the old stations. It is a long way out of the way to access public conveniences which are in the townships, so people who are in dire need

often use the bushes which is unhygienic. People are unaware of where the toilets are and, in some places, there is a ride up a very steep hill which is off-putting especially to those who are riding with their children..

- At the Redwoods in East Warburton, people have been urinating and defecating in people's yards
- Yes, too many tourists piss and shit on the side of the road.
- Easier access for cars to park - in Healesville
- The public toilets in the middle of Belgrave are a disgrace. They detract from the appearance of the town and make neighbouring businesses unappealing. Relocate them to another area.
- Council has removed public toilets despite an increase in population and a push to increase tourism - this is ridiculous!
- It should have a high priority or maintain the high priority it has. Clean, accessible public toilets are essential in all towns - but are particularly important in tourist towns where visitors need to have a positive experience - finding and using them. This is not to say they are not clean and good in Healesville at the moment - they are pretty good but this needs to be maintained.
- The toilets are often not clean. The taps that are used in Olinda and Monbulk toilets are very difficult for people like me who have a physical disability
- Along the Birrarung, upstream from Warburton, it's not uncommon to come across human excrement and toilet paper in the riparian zone.
- In our area we need more and they are definitely maintained enough during busy periods.
- Need more
- More needed in Warburton
- They need to be cleaned and well maintained.
- Not enough public toilets along the Warburton Hwy and poorly signposted which leads to issues like human faeces along hiking trails and tourist sites (eg Redwood forest)
- Lack of identification
- It can be hard to find public toilets, for example travelling to Olinda, sassafras, upwey, areas its hard to find public toilets espically ones that fell modern, clean and safe.
- Public toilets are always a priority in every town and they need to be maintained regularly and within distances of popular shopping areas.
- More available and clearly signed existing ones.
- Need more
- Should be more of them
- Public toilets need to be updated, they are outdated.
- need to be clean!
- Improve the cleanliness of public toilets during peak tourism times.

- Wwe need more and to ensure that they are always clean
- There are not many and if they are out of service can be tricky!
- There isn't enough and what is there needs to be cleaner.
- It took Council months to repair the public toilets in Queens Park. They are great now but the process took far too long.
- All toilets are shocking. In particular the one opposite Commonwealth Bank Belgrave. Also Belgrave Sth next to tennis courts. Upwey behind shops.
- Lilydale toilets are a disgrace. We need to do better or we will lose clientele
- often the toilets at Healesville are full people lined up outside. noting that many cafes don't offer toilet facilities so people need the public ones
- 1 set of public toilets in Green street (supposed to service the whole main street of Healesville) and these are quite poorly maintained during busy periods, makes a mockery of public amenities. Again not enough for residents AND tourists
- Not enough in town and the appalling state of them after a few hours is a sight to see, not.
- Was hard to find sometime
- Clean toilets are a very high priority for visitors to our region.
- The belgrave township public toilets in the shop area are not great to look at and I would never use them, they need to go to another place please.
- Not enough public toilets, the ones you have are disgusting or used for suicides like the Wesburn one. Need well lit, clean toilets in visible areas so they feel safe.
- More needed around Warburton
- there shud be more public toilets , located in strategic positions , to accommodate tourists.
- Finding public toilets in the Yarra Valley is often very difficult. After living here most of my life I am aware of where they are and the quality levels of them but most visitors really struggle to find them when looking. It's imperative there are quality public toilets available around markets, town centres and sporting complexes and that they are readily identified and easily accessed
- They are filthy, cobwebs, bird poo, build-up of dirt throughout, new toilets are cheaply constructed, no connection with the local area amenity or culture. Public toilets have clearly received minimal investment for many, many years. Go to other tourism regions and their public toilets are not only superior in build quality and connection with the area, they are so clean throughout they shine.
- To make sure they are available so visitors needs are taken care of
- To many tourists for current amenities and need to be cleaned more.
- They set the standard for the town. If they are clean and interesting or creative in some way, they can be a tourist attraction in themselves. But the overall experience can make or break a memory of a town.
- More accessible and more required in high tourist areas

- The public toilets need to be better maintained for cleanliness. The existing toilets are suitable - but they need to be CLEANED more regularly and looked after.
- Need to be easily accessible and with signage in each town
- When out longer than an hour with young children or older people (like self) toilets are essential specially when travelling with others and you are more constrained to suit everyone. Women also need toilets more regularly during menstruation. Babies need some recycling of paper nappies - even though I used cloth nappies to save the environment I used paper nappies for grandchildren when on a pleasure trip as cloth was too hard. Good arrangements for the paper nappies were non existent ten years ago.
- Very few around and most are out of date and grotty
- Public toilets at local parks - Yarra Glen, Queens park etc need updating (more of them, regularly cleaned, nicer looking) Better signage for toilets.
- Clean, modern and accessible public toilets are essential
- Olinda need additional facilities
- Visitors are relieving themselves in the streets. We do have several public toilets, but the volume of tourists severely outweighs the available facilities.
- Ensuring not just the quality and cleanliness of public toilets but ensuring adequate signage and promotion so that people know where they are
- Need better cleaning frequency
- More servicing of these during peak times.
- Sassafras toilets are a prime example of lack of amenities. They are often so dirty and smell it is well known and a disservice to all the store holders.
- They are dirty and the druggies hang around them in Lilydale
- There are very few Public Toilets on the paths connecting townships and within townships. Along Brushy creek, From Chirnside Park to Mooroolbark for example there are no public toilets. Similar for a lot of the Warburton trail. Public Toilets (with baby change room) should be available every 30 minutes walk.
- The public toilets are always graffitied and small awful. Don't feel safe using the with homeless people around
- Toilet facilities are very necessary along the rail trail.
- ongoing maintenance of any existing facilities are a necessity
- Pubic toilets need to be addressed
- Just in general.
- Queens park (healesville), dirty, damaged, poor lighting, unsightly, no deterrent for vandals. Main st, (healesville) exposed, dirty, no soap or sanitiser, pedestrians step out in front of oncoming traffic. Train park (healesville) no functional toilets Tourist info centre (healesville) dirty, damaged, poor lighting, unsightly, not safe - have to cross busy rd from playground with kids, etc

- A lot of the toilets are broken, filthy, vandalism is a huge issue.
- We need more public toilets in Healesville
- Have you been to them on the weekends?
- More so the signage of public toilets - tourists clearly don't know where to find them so choose to do their business wherever.
- Belgrave public toilets are in the Main Street, open and ugly. I have no idea where emerald public toilets are. Toilets need to be very well sign posted. Blend into the existing area and be well maintained.
- More public toilet access after dark if you are promoting night time experiences.
- I think toilet blocks on the Walking trail would be appropriate between Seville railway and Launching Place.
- ensure that they are cleaned frequently and maintained appropriately (includes repair of vandalised equipment and graffiti)
- Public toilets are few and far between..they need to be cleaned often and checked for paper etc.. this resonates with visitors who influence others about visiting our area
- As a parent with young children, there needs to be a sufficient number of toilets available to the public that are CLEAN, HYGENIC and MAINTAINED. The number of times I walk into (& straight back out of) disgusting toilets, or toilets that don't have any soap in the dispensers is too often!
- One set of toilets in an area of Healesville for example means businesses wear the brunt of patrons and visitors requirements
- Healesville public toilets in Queens park are a problem.
- Mount Evelyn has one public toilet and one at the servo. There is a case to reinstate the one near the scout hall.
- Public toilets need regular upgrading in order to keep our region attractive to visitors and for them to use them. Dee Rd toilets in Millgrove are in dire need of upgrading with visitors accessing the O'Shaughnessy Aqueduct trail through this point.
- More public toilets would be useful, and ensuring that they are well maintained. A lot of visitors to the water park and main strip of warburton and the river, but not many public toilets

- Due to over tourism there are not enough toilets
- Better signage. More facilities. Cleaned more often.
- Clean public toilets at Park entrances
- Cleanliness is important!
- In the YRC area, there are numerous parks without any public toilets
- Need toilets at the redwood forest as this beautiful area is littered with toilet paper, wipes and human faeces all the time, when it is accessible to the general public. At the moment it is not accessible via Cement Ck rd
- Just a tidy up most are dated
- Living on rail trail we are constantly cleaning up human excrement it's disgusting
- Totally inadequate number of toilets, what more is there to say? If tourists can't find a toilet, they just go anywhere. Talk to locals in the Warburton and Redwood forest areas.
- Insufficient number of and/ or clean public toilets throughout region.
- A real nightmare if no loos and young children. so therefore a high priority
- It's important that there are accessible and available public toilet's in the Dandenong Ranges that are clean and user friendly.
- Need better national park management and facilities
- There aren't enough of them in the region and some are poorly maintained.

- Specifically around main tourist attractions
- There is little or no access at many public spaces
- Toilets are important for families with young children as well as the older generation. Public toilets can be difficult to find if not well signed @ if you have had a long journey to get to the ranges, it can be a priority to find a toilet before you can enjoy what yarra ranges had to offer.
- It's important for people visiting to have access to public toilets, in some towns the only access is through cafes and restaurants
- Public toilets are essential for visitors and locals. There is nothing worse than toilet paper and tissues just off pathways where people have been out walking, nature calls and there is no toilet at high visitor sites. They need to be regularly maintained, all access ability toilets.
- No
- It's knowing where they are and their proximity to where people are gathering. It also depends on how many people are there and how often they are cleaned!!!! Allowing intensive housing and reducing block sizes means residents have less space to entertain and these events end up in community spaces, making some places overcrowded.
- Need more of them in Healesville. Plus, the Green St facilities compromise the safety of cars and pedestrians using that intersection.
- Public toilets are dirty, broken facilities & even after reporting these issues to phone numbers on the blocks, nothing gets done. Too many people visiting the area also don't think there's anything wrong with relieving themselves publicly
- If visitor numbers were to be encouraged, public toilet facilities need to be catered for as a simple basic consideration. The drives can be long as there is so much to see and as outdoor activities can be remote, visitors of any age, but particularly the increase in older age group, is an important factor.
- Not enough and the ones here are not maintained

We need to make sure that we leave large areas of open land to set our towns as different and more beautiful than suburban areas .

- The only public toilets I know available are in Belgrave. We want to ensure people are not defecating in nature, there need to be more public amenities.

- provide clean toilets that don't stink. it isn't rocket science.
- Sometimes when visitors are in high numbers, the public toilets are too few (redwood forest for example) resulting in the areas becoming dirty and smelly. If the council wants to attract visitors then these basic facilities need to be met, no matter what.
- Maybe throw a bug bomb in there occasionally so we're not wiping our bums with spiderwebs or being attacked by ants.
- Not so much public toilets per se, but the provision of dump points for campervans and the like.
- not enough along walks
- Toilets at the old golf course now a playground often out of order
- The number of public toilets and routine cleanliness needs to be drastically improved. There are simply not enough public toilets in YVDR.
- Not enough public toilets around Warburton on peak times.
- Improved cleaning and more available
- Attractive toilets like those in Healesville and Lilydale - need more of those
- Always need more public toilets and located next to key areas. Our business allows visitors to use the toilets and because we are in the centre of town we have a tremendous number of people come through only for that (they do not then enjoy what we have to offer). So while there are toilets in Warburton, another block at the centre of town is needed and near other "hot" spots, as we have found visitors relieving themselves in people's private green spaces. Amazing, really.
- There are no clean ones
- No!
- it is not just public toilets...generally speaking, our area is a disgrace. It is unkempt, dangerous, and inaccessible to humans. People are frightened of the trees, for good reason, they are dangerous and it is ridiculous that the Council prioritises mountain ash trees over human life, and property.
- Easily accessible and well maintained facilities, in keeping with their situation, ie, low key buildings
- Lots of kids parks with no facilities. When kids need to go, it's a little too late to get in a car and drive to the closest toilet block.
- There are useless toilets at Seville very hard to access for disabled the toilets at Wandin rundown and old the toilets with disgusting murals. Toilets at Warburton filthy and dirty at all sites. Cleaners need to clean properly no spider webs or filth.
- In Healesville the locals toilets are often vandalised and dirty. Security could be beneficial. There is no public toilets near the train station playground in Healesville. Signage says that the toilets are 100metres away, but it's often locked and inaccessible. For a playground for children, you can't expect them to hold on and walk into town.

- Public toilets near places like redwood forest or near Wittons reserve are needed. Cleanliness of the toilets is important too.
- Ensuring that they are clean and equipped with soap is important to myself and my family
- Yeah just need clean and readily accessible toilets that local and abroad tourists can confidently use. When there are not so convenient ones placed through our area compared to what some might be used to.
- It's embarrassing to direct visitors to the terrible, dark, smelly and potentially dangerous public toilets in Sassafras. They are often filthy and are potentially not a safe place for single females to go to.
- Public toilets along the Warburton - LILYDALE rail trail need to at a few more of the stations. Eg WANDIN Nth, Seville or Sunny side (Killara) would be suitable locations
- Not enough of them, as I mentioned previously redwood forest has none unless that has changed since temporary closure. Warburton the shops & waterwheel section of town has very little toilet facilities considering the amount of people that come to the river for picnics and walks & looking through shops.

- Yes this is a priority. The No.1 question is why is there exposed public toilets on the main street in Belgrave? It does NOT enhance the streets visual appeal nor does it offer the privacy you'd usually expect from a public facility. Please don't create more facilities like this, it's not good design nor does it promote an environment friendly approach. Put the public toilet facilities off the main road near a park or super market and have signs that point the way. This has to be the biggest put off to the area other than the street scape itself. Look at towns like Arrowtown in NZ for inspiration of street design & layout. PLEASE!!!!
- Often hard to find and not clean or nice quality
- I believe that tourism promoted places ie the Redwood forest should have toilets and rubbish bins to prevent the place being spoilt.
- Accessible and inclusive public toilets are an important enabler
- More access to public toilets, more regular cleaning schedules, security patrols or cameras to help keep vandals away
- it is a low priority. the toilets are adequate for the people who LIVE here. I don't really care about the visitors; I'd rather they weren't here.
- No
- It's self evident. People need these.
- Public toilets should be located at the entrance of Black Flat. People use the bush instead.
- No
- Some of the state and national parks have insufficient toilet facilities.
- All the public toilets are old and disgusting they need to be updated
- Not enough in local areas to accommodate tourists and daily outings and are not looked after adequately always vandalised and disgusting

- Public toilets in red wood forest. Cleaning of public toilets maintenance.
- Sufficient access to public toilets and their daily management at an appropriate standard
- The facilities are embarrassing for us, we feel ashamed when family and friends visit, by how backward and neglected our area is.
- We'd like to see more
- Clean, safe toilets should be made available
- There should be plenty of public toilets for locals and visitors
- Wild toileting everywhere during tourist peak times - we have even caught tourists using our front garden as a toilet and we are in Millgrove. They do it in the main street without any shame at all and the public toilets are packed and quickly filthy in peak times.
- Public toilets should be signposted more clearly, and there should be at least one in every town.
- Need to be cleaned more regularly, more accessible public toilets
- Public areas around the Yarra where people gather. ie next the Advent Care. There is no toilets there and now when the Water Park is full. these huge family Groups come at weekends and leave rubbish as well . No Bins . People just lazy to take rubbish home.
- Lots of great walks but people need public toilets
- Take the public toilets out of the main street of Belgrave! They are an eyesore and detract from the aesthetic of the town. It is also quite irritating to see people urinating at the side of roads or worse, emerging from bushland having relieved themselves. Better signage for public toilets and possibly more public toilets in smaller villages.
- There are no public toilets in Kallista (although there are plenty at Grant's picnic ground) and the only public toilets in Sassafra are the spooky ones behind the hall.
- Make sure all public toilets are clean and that everything works in them. Eg door closes, plenty of paper and a bin.
